Secondary School Night

Secondary School Night provides an excellent opportunity to learn about independent secondary schools in the greater St. Louis area. There is an ever-increasing demand for attendance at independent schools, and families are wise to consider different choices. Families can gather input and background information on the schools from their admission representatives. No advance registration is required and admission is free.

The program will begin with an open house general information session where families are encouraged to speak informally with the representatives from the various schools, ask questions, and pick up information and admission materials. After the general session each school's representatives will be available in a separate room for three consecutive 25-minute information sessions. This format offers an opportunity to receive more detailed information and ask questions. Most ISSL Schools have financial aid programs for families.

COMMON DATES

Some of the elementary and secondary Independent Schools of St. Louis (ISSL) have agreed to common dates for the mailing of decision letters and the return of enrollment contracts. For students applying to these schools for the 2011/2012 school year, decision letters will be mailed on **Thursday, March 15, 2012** with the exception of 9th Grade. The common response deadline for the return of enrollment contracts to schools is **Wednesday, April 11, 2012** with the exception of 9th Grade. Some schools use a rolling admission process. Be sure to check with the school(s) to which you are applying for their notification and response dates.

Entrance Testing for Most ISSL Secondary Independent Schools

As a component of the admission process, most independent schools require that applicants take entrance tests to assess their potential for academic success and for purposes of placement within their program. As a service and convenience to parents and their children, several independent schools in St. Louis have joined forces to simplify and streamline testing procedures and dates. The following schools accept the SSAT as an entrance test: Chaminade College Preparatory School, The College School, Crossroads College Preparatory School, John Burroughs School, MICDS, Saint Louis Priory School, The St. Michael School of Clayton, Thomas Jefferson School, Villa Duchesne and Oak Hill School, Visitation Academy and Whitfield School. While sharing the SSAT as a common entrance test, participating schools may differ in the importance and interpretation they give to score results. Taking the SSAT is only one part of the admission procedure. Parents are responsible for returning specific application materials to EACH school to which their child applies. Throughout the admission process, parents should continue to confer with the schools in which they are interested to be sure they have met all admission requirements.

Visit www.ssat.org for complete information about the test, test dates, test preparation, test registration, and special accommodations information. Registration for the 2011-12 SSAT opens online August 1.

The SSAT:

- a) The National Test is given at participating schools in St. Louis in November, December, January, February and March.
- b) Regional (or Flex) Test allows schools, groups of schools, and educational consultants to administer a complete form of the SSAT at their convenience any time throughout the year.
- c) National test can be taken multiple times and on any of the eight annual National Test administrations; the Flex test can be taken only once during the SSAT testing year (August 1-July 31);
- d) Test location has no bearing on the admission process at a family's school of choice;
- e) Score Reports can be sent to as many schools as needed, either before or after viewing the child's scores; Score Reports ordered online are free and unlimited.
- f) The registration deadline for National Test dates is three weeks in advance of the test date; the late deadline (online only) is two weeks before test date and an additional fee applies.
- g) Registration deadlines for a Regional (or Flex) Test date are traditionally two weeks prior to testing.
- h) Schools do not accept walk-in registrants; all students must be registered prior to testing. Some sites allow standby registrations, which enable families to register up until the day before (online only, additional fee applies, and testing is not guaranteed).

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions:

- Parents may register for National Tests by mail, fax, or online at www.ssat.org; for Flex Test dates go to www.ssat.org/flex.
- Testing begins at 9AM unless otherwise stated. Test location, alternate test time (if necessary), and any special notes are included on the student's Admission Ticket. Plan to arrive at the test center by 8:30 am to ensure proper check-in, especially if you are a standby tester.
- The test is composed of four parts (Writing, Quantitative, Verbal and Reading Comprehension) and runs slightly over three hours including two breaks. Test dismissal is normally between 12 noon and 12:30 pm.
- Students should bring his/her admission ticket, sharpened #2 pencils, and a good eraser.
- Most scores are released to schools approximately one week after the test date. Scores are released to families (by mail, FedEx, and e-mail) a few days after the school score release date. Allow an additional week for delivery by US first class mail (delivery time varies).
- To add or change score recipients at no charge, students can use the "Manage My Account" pages online at www.ssat.org. Any add/cancel score requests submitted to SSAT for processing will incur a transaction fee.
- Test Fee: \$116.

Applying to Secondary Schools with the SSAT Standard Application Online

Most St. Louis schools accept the SSATB Standard Application Online as their application for admission. For more information, visit the ISSL website (www.independentschools.org) and click on the "Apply" tab. The general application deadline for most St. Louis area independent schools is Friday, January 20, 2012. Some schools may be able to consider students after this deadline but it is highly encouraged that students submit their applications by this date. It is also recommended that students take the SSAT by February 4, 2012 for primary consideration. Complete contact information for participating schools is available at www.independentschools.org

1. Register for the test using the appropriate address above. Create an SSAT account to begin. Alternately, request a Student Registration Guide from SSAT or download one online at ssat.org.
2. Choose the most convenient date and test center from the calendar, regardless of whether the student intends to apply there. A student may choose to send scores to any participating school, no matter where he or she takes the SSAT. School codes are listed in this booklet and online at www.ssat.org.
3. Payment is due by Visa, MasterCard or SSAT Fee Waiver. A limited number of fee waivers are available from participating schools and must be obtained before you register for the test. 2011-2012 US/Canada Test Fee (Flex or National Registration): \$116.
4. Print a copy of your SSAT Admission Ticket to take with you to the test center. This ticket confirms your registration and includes your SSAT Registration Number.
5. On the day of the test, arrive promptly at the school by the start time listed on your SSAT Admission Ticket. Be sure to bring several sharpened #2 pencils and a good eraser, as these will not be provided by the test center. Students are not permitted to bring calculators, cell phones and/or any other electronic device into the testing room.

Standard Application Online

Families may apply electronically to independent secondary schools by linking to the Standard Application Online (SAO) from the ISSL website at www.independentschools.org. The Standard Application Online is secure and allows the parent and student to review and modify the Student Information (Part 1), Student Questionnaire (Part 2), and Parent Statement (Part 3) prior to submission to each school. Transcript and teacher recommendation forms are available for download. No matter how many schools to which a child applies, only one copy of teacher recommendations and transcripts are required. Instructions are provided for downloading and disseminating these forms. When using the SAO, recommendation forms are mailed directly to SSATB by the appropriate school officials, electronically attached to the child's application, and electronically delivered to schools via a secure portal.

Standard Application Information

Most ISSL secondary schools accept SSATB's Standard Application form, which is accepted by nearly 700 private and independent day and boarding schools in the U.S. and Canada. Parents should contact the school to which they are applying for school-specific information about admission procedures and deadlines. Parents may obtain a paper copy of the Standard Application form from:

- ISSL elementary schools;
- ISSL secondary schools; or
- the ISSL website, www.independentschools.org, by downloading the Standard Application.

If a family utilizes the paper form of the Standard Application, the applicant's parents should keep the original and submit copies of the Student Information (Part 1), Student Questionnaire (Part 2), and Parent Statement (Part 3) of the Standard Application to the school(s) to which they are applying. Transcript and teacher recommendation forms should be given to the child's current school for completion and direct mailing to the school(s) to which the child is applying.

A student may sit for a test listed on these test dates more than once. Parents may register for National Tests by mail, fax, or online at www.ssat.org. SSAT does not allow walk-in registrations, though some sites allow standby registrations, which enable families to register up to and including the morning of the exam (online only, additional fee applies, and testing is not guaranteed). All National Test sites allow for 30 extra minutes of testing time for approved students; Special Testing Application (A) applies; see www.ssat.org for details and instructions. All National Tests start at 9:00 AM. Check In begins at 8:30 AM.
